Day 1 Sat. Warsaw

Arrive Warsaw. You will be met and transferred to your hotel. Meet your fellow travellers tonight for a short walk in the Old Town and dinner at a local restaurant. Overnight Warsaw. **D**

Day 2 Sun. Warsaw

Morning sightseeing tour of Warsaw and its old town, which was totally reconstructed after WWII. Included is a visit to the royal palace. After lunch at a local restaurant, see the former Warsaw Ghetto and visit the Wedel Chocolate Factory. Evening Chopin piano recital. Overnight Warsaw. **BL**

Day 3 Mon. Warsaw To Zakopane

Morning departure to Zakopane via Czestochowa, where you visit the country's national shrine - the Jasna Gora Monastery. Its famous blackened painting of St. Mary is known as the Black Madonna. After lunch,

continue to picturesque Zakopane, nestled in the foothills of the Tatra Mountains. Overnight Zakopane. **BL**

Day 4 Tue. Zakopane To Krakow

After breakfast, you have a sightseeing tour of Zakopane with its unique wooden architecture. Enjoy the breathtaking views of the Tatras from the summit of Gubalowka mountain, followed by a boat trip through the Dunajec River Gorge (both subject to weather conditions). Tonight's dinner is at your hotel. Overnight Krakow. **BD**

Day 5 Wed. Krakow

Krakow was the capital of Poland and the Seat of Kings until 1596. The city remained relatively unscathed from WWII. Your morning sightseeing includes Wawel Castle and the Old Town, with its medieval town square, one of the largest in Europe. After lunch, drive to Auschwitz to visit the Martyrdom Museum of the former Nazi concentration camp. Overnight Krakow. **BL**

Day 6 Thu. Krakow

Morning free. In the afternoon, visit the Wieliczka Salt Mine, with lakes, underground chambers, grottoes and chapels carved from salt by generations of Polish miners over 700 years. Enjoy dinner with a folklore performance in Wieliczka. Overnight Krakow. **BD**

Day 7 Fri. Krakow

Your tour services end after the breakfast with your transfer to the airport. **B**

Day 8 Sat. Torun to Gdansk

Morning sightseeing of Torun the birthplace of Copernicus. You'll see the 13th century Town Hall, superb churches and historic streets, as well as a visit to the Copernicus Museum. After lunch in a local restaurant drive to Gdansk for a brief walk through the Old Town. Overnight Gdansk. **BL**

Day 9 Sun. Gdansk & Malbork

Your tour of Gdansk tour starts from the Upland Gate, passes the Prison Tower and Torture House and goes on to the Golden Gate and Long Market with its Grand Mansions. See the Artus Court and St. Mary's Basilica before continuing to Malbork for lunch and a visit to the Teutonic Knights Castle. Overnight Gdansk. **BL**

Day 10 Mon. Gdansk to Warsaw

Drive to Gdynia, the youngest of the tri-city complex. In the fashionable seaside resort of Sopot you will see Europe's oldest and longest wooden pier. Enjoy a short pipe organ concert in Oliwa Cathedral and return to Warsaw after lunch. Overnight Warsaw. **BL**

Day 11 Tue. Warsaw
